Hay Creek flows south out of the Brighton State Recreation Area (5000 acres of rolling hills interspersed with many lakes and trails), enters Bass Lake, and then flows to Gallagher Lake, which is a lake in the Huron River.

Brighton State Rec area and other undeveloped public land in the upper portions of the watershed are one of the main reasons the Huron River remains clean and

healthy throughout much of its run. HRWC has found that Hay Creek consistently supports sensitive insect families, which are a sign of healthy and thriving ecosystems. However, as the Hay creekshed becomes developed as a residential area for commuters, the quality of the creek could decline because of the added pollution and disturbances to the natural water flow patterns. Eight percent of the creekshed currently is covered by impervious surface, which is where creeks start to see negative effects on the habitat, insect, and fish populations.

Let's keep the Hay creekshed covered with as much natural land as possible!

Head Brewer Tim Schmidt has brewed up a Hay Creek Rye Ale. This light, refreshing ale is brewed with barley and rye, hopped lightly using Centennial hops and spiced with orange peel, lemon peel, and coriander. The Centennial hops provide a light-medium bodied flavor with a slight hoppy bitterness. At 5.5% alcohol by volume, it should be a fantastically drinkable summer brew!

Tim moved to Ann Arbor in 2005 and started assistant brewing in 2007 at Grizzly Peak with Duncan Williams. Tim attended the Siebel World Brewing Academy in Chicago in 2007 & 2008, and became the Head Brewer at Blue Tractor in 2008. Tim enjoys the small brewing system at Blue Tractor as it allows him to brew and tweak his batches weekly.
