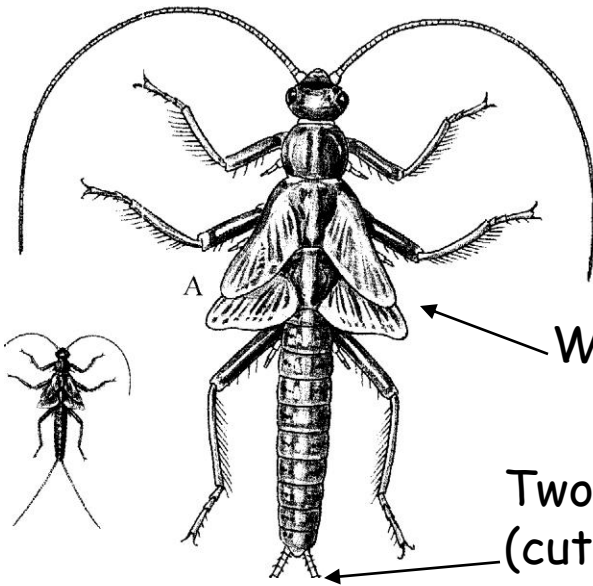


Stoneflies look like this....

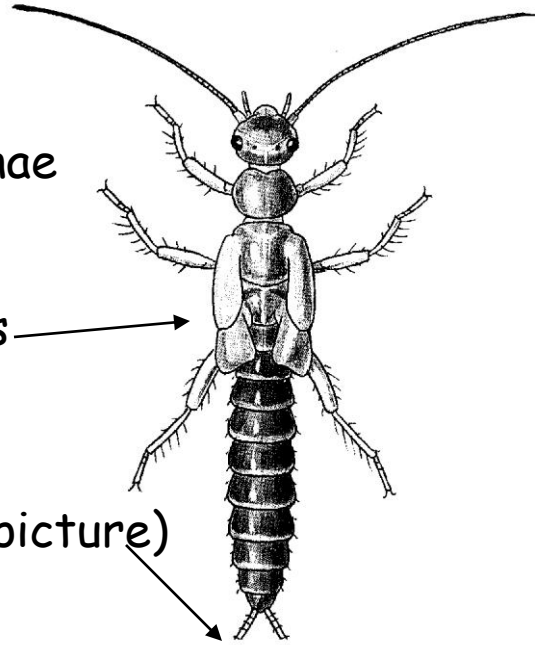


Winter Stonefly
Family: Taeniopterygidae

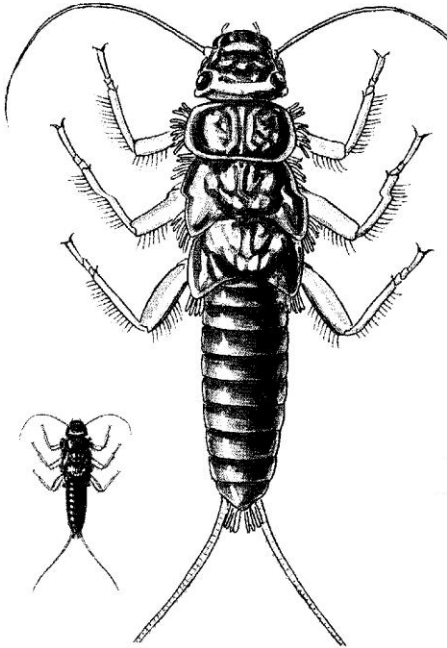
Long antennae

Wingpads

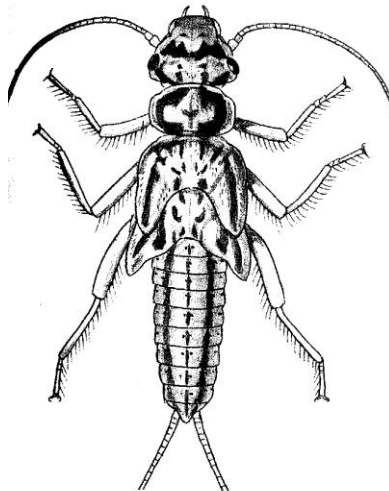
Two tails
(cut off in picture)



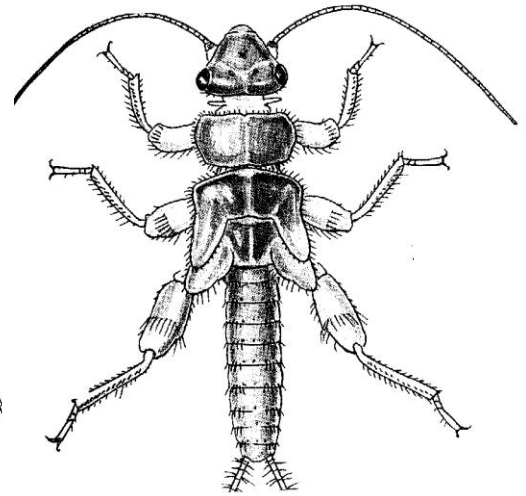
Small Winter Stonefly

Family: Perlidae



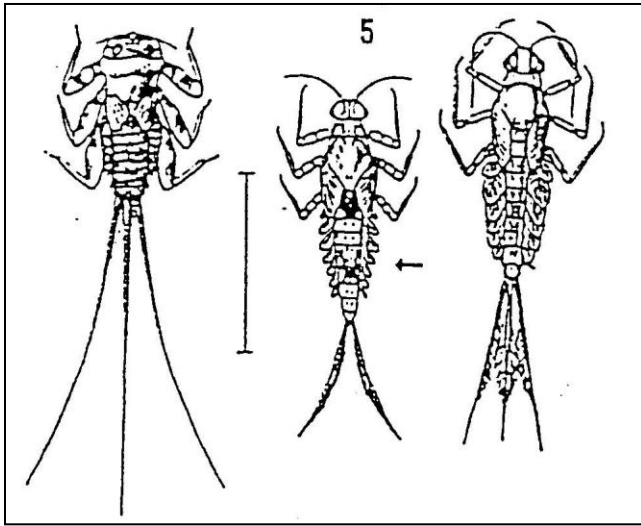
Perlodid Stonefly
Family: Perlodidae



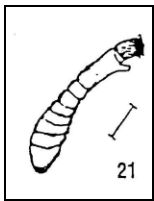
Nemourid Stonefly

Note: These bottom three stoneflies are not "winter" stoneflies, but may be present and should be kept.

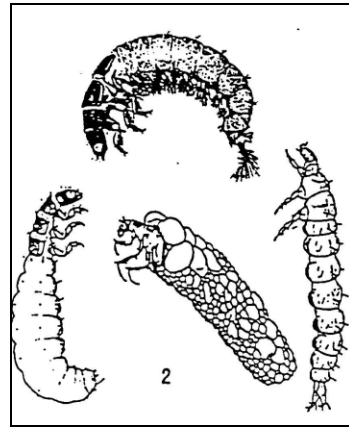
Stoneflies do NOT look like this.....



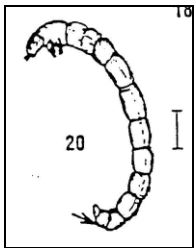
These are mayflies, the most easily confused insect with stoneflies. They have wingpads, but have 3 tails and shorter antennae.



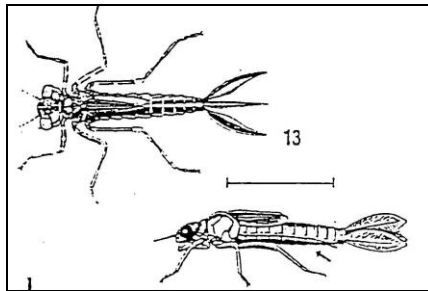
Blackfly Larva



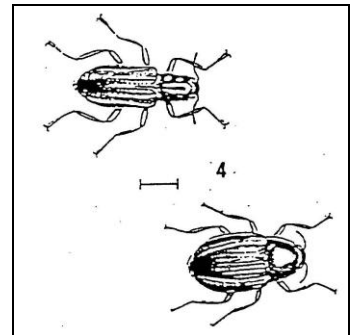
Caddisfly Larva



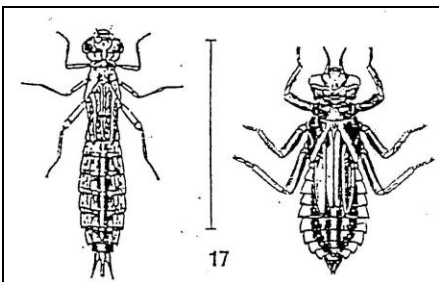

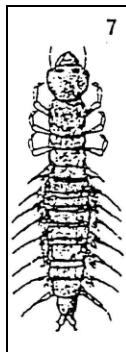

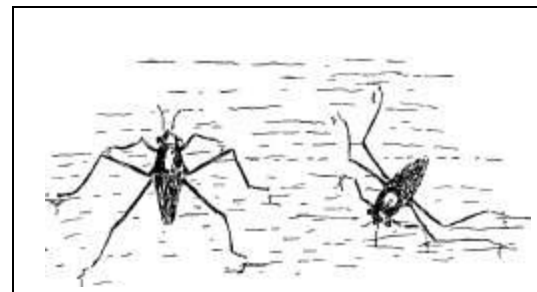
