Get paid to reduce phosphorus runoff into the Huron River and Lake Erie with sustainable and profitable long-term conservation approaches that benefit your whole farm.

Work with our farm consultants to explore flexible and cost-effective conservation techniques at the field level. Your farm and field data combined with watershed-level nutrient and economic modeling will predict measurable phosphorus reductions. You choose which techniques are best for you and become eligible for payment if and when you implement them.

Eligible farms are in Washtenaw and Livingston counties in the Boyden, Honey, Fleming, Mill and Portage Creek areas. There does not need to be a waterway on your property. Funding is limited and is available on a first-come, first-served basis.
